

# Homophobic & transphobic hate crime reporting

**OLGA is a Hate Crime Reporting group trained by the Police. Because of lack of confidence in Police forces dealing with hate crimes nationally, our communities are under reporting.**

OLGA sits on our local Independent Advisory Group for the Police. We recently met with the new Police Superintendent for the Scarborough area, in an effort to improve our confidence to report.

OLGA raised concerns about the awareness of the Hate Crime Reporting process both with the front line staff at Police

Stations, Call centers and our own community. North Yorkshire Police have prepared the following article for YOU, so you are clear about the process and the service you SHOULD receive.



North Yorkshire Police is committed to ensuring that it offers a first class service to the members of the community that it serves and deals with each and every incident in a fair, impartial and transparent manner.

The continued protection of vulnerable persons is a key element of North Yorkshire Polices Control Strategy and is clearly embedded within daily business with robust processes in place to ensure a quality service is provided.

Hate Crimes are relatively infrequent in North Yorkshire however in order to understand the impact that these occurrences have on peoples lives, comprehensive training has been given to employees of North Yorkshire Police, not only to understand how to deal with such an incident, but to also have an understanding of what a 'Hate Crime' is.

**'A hate crime is any criminal offence committed against a person or property that is motivated by an offenders hatred of someone because of their:**

- Race, colour, origin, nationality or national origins
- Religion
- Sexual orientation
- Gender or gender identity
- Disability

NB It is important to remember that a hate crime has occurred if any person (including police officers) perceives that the motivation for the offence was due to hatred of one of the protected characteristics.

# Reporting Methods

There are a number of ways in which a victim or a witness of any crime, including a hate crime, can report such an incident. These are as follows:

<p><b>Dial 999 in an Emergency if:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There is the use, or immediate threat of use, of violence</li> <li>• There is serious injury to a person and / or serious damage to property</li> <li>• A crime is, or is likely to be serious, and in progress</li> </ul>	<p><b>Dial 101 for all Non-Emergencies and you will be given 3 options as follows:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Press 1 to report a crime, incident, or to provide information</li> <li>• If you know the name of the person or department that you want to speak to press 2</li> <li>• To speak to the custody suite press 3</li> </ul>	<p><b>Text phone 18001 101 - for all Non-Emergencies</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To contact an officer, police station, or to report an incident that does not require immediate attention or for general enquiries. This service is provided by the RNID Text Relay service and is suitable for people who have a hearing or speech impairment.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Text phone 18000 - in an Emergency</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If there is a crime in progress or if there is a threat to life. This service is provided by the RNID Text Relay service and is suitable for people who have a hearing or speech impairment.</li> </ul>	<p><b>EmergencySMS</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Emergency SMS service lets deaf, hard of hearing and speech-impaired people in the UK send an SMS text message to the UK 999 service where it will be passed to the police, ambulance, fire rescue, or coastguard. Register your mobile phone now; don't wait until you need the EmergencySMS service.</li> </ul>	

# Service Standards

**As part of North Yorkshire Police Service Standards, we will endeavor to attend all 'Emergency' calls within 15 minutes if within an urban location and 20 minutes if within a rural location.**

Incidents that are 'Non Emergencies' where the call

taker deems the reportee or person subject to the call to be vulnerable will be prioritized and attended within 60 minutes of the call being received.

Officers and staff are aware of the potential sensitive nature of incidents reported and will as far as is possible offer a face to face service within an environment that is private from other members of the public within police premises.

The importance of reporting such incidents is paramount in keeping our communities safe

and to ensure an easy process, we have ensured the following:

**We Have -**

- Helped communities to keep their neighbourhoods safe by giving them one easy way to contact their local police and to report non-emergency crime and disorder
- Made the police more accessible to their communities, while reducing pressure on the 999 system and helping the police to allocate their resources where they are needed most ►

# Service Standards (continued)

- Assisted the police to cut crime by making it easier for the public to pass on information about crimes in their neighbourhoods - allowing the police to take swift action

- Enabled local partners to join up with the police to provide communities with even easier access to a wider range of local services

Calls to 101 (from both landlines and mobiles) cost 15 pence per call no matter what time of day you call, or how long you are on the phone.

If an individual does not feel

that they can access the police using the above methods then we have a number of Hate Incident Reporting Centres across North Yorkshire where information can be passed and shared to ensure that offenders are brought to justice and that each concern is taken seriously to ensure the best possible outcome for the victim.

# Prostate Cancer UK PROSTATE CANCER UK

**This organisation is remarketing itself throughout the Country. Part of its updating is to look at its equality and diversity awareness as regards gay, bisexual and trans men with prostate cancer.**

Mary, OLGA Project Co-ordinator was invited to speak at their recent conference. The Trans issue in particular had to be stressed and explained very clearly. In OLGA's consultation and workshop work, we found audiences very ignorant about the fact that a person born

male can undergo a transition to a new gender, and still have a prostate.

Some gay men were there who have had prostate cancer treatment. They would have liked advice and support from a gay group to help them through their treatment, etc. Again, the problem of coming out was voiced. Do you tell your partner, how do you tell your partner, does this mean that you cannot have sex anymore?

Prostate Cancer UK know that gay, bisexual and trans men are not being identified, and accept that they need to improve their

care needs assessment language. Also, they agreed they need a massive programme of user-led equality and diversity training.

The treatments for prostate cancer are improving and are quiet varied, including surgery and chemotherapy. And the survival rates are improving also. The message is, try and speak to your GP about your prostate if you think you may have a problem.

# Latest Research

**Yet again, Stonewall's research shows the same findings.**

Nationally we are not coming out to service providers. When we come out in health and social care we are abused and discriminated against. The Human Rights Commission just revealed that 1/5th of Councils

have not bothered to do their Equality Policies. This is two years after the Equality Law required them to do so.

So, who will make them do it? Probably me and you. Why don't you ask to see your local Council's Equality and Diversity Policy. It should have been updated since 2010. Please let OLGA know any interesting

things you find out.

Another way you could get involved in improving health and social care provision is to contact your local NHS LINK Group and volunteer to do "Enter and View". You will be trained, and able to enter and view health and social care venues, with a view to improving services.

# Our rights, our voices

**OLGA is involved in a new project with Age UK, funded by Comic Relief.**

The project aims to empower older people to find out about human rights and how they can make a difference. There are eight forums across the Country, of which OLGA is one.

Each forum is recruiting up to ten volunteers to become "Human Rights Ambassadors" for a period of three years. Each ambassador will undertake human rights training. After that the ambassadors will devise a project as individuals or as part of their forum, that will have an impact on human rights. There

are one or two spaces in the OLGA forum if you are interested. Our first training session is November 21st 2012 in York. Travel expenses paid. Food and top level training by Amnesty International. Get involved and get a voice.
