Dear Member,

Spring is being heralded by both the daffodils and the news of the successful passing of the new Marriage (Same Sex Couples) Bill.

On 5th Feb MPs voted by a majority of 225 in favour of the new Marriage Bill (Same Sex Couples) Bill. The final vote in favour of marriage was 400 to 175 at Second Reading

and the Bill will now go into its Commons Committee Stage.

As the last piece of the legislative jigsaw providing equality for lesbian, gay and bisexual people in Britain, this is a truly historic step forward. We're absolutely delighted that MPs have demonstrated so overwhelmingly that they're in touch with the twenty-first century (see article on page 5 - for more comments).

OLGA Social

We often invite co-ordinators from other organizations to come along and talk to our members. On March 4th 2013 Age Concern, Yorkshire & Humber are visiting our Monday social and presenting a workshop on the subject of depression amongst older LGBT people. Loneliness, isolation, ageing alone and single, are issues well older known to **LGBT** researchers. The importance of staying in contact with other gay and trans people is crucial for good mental health. So, groups like OLGA, need to be developed throughout the Country.

Part of offering social support is OLGA's regular Meet & Eat activities. Usually attendees go from the Social for a meal somewhere in Scarborough. This ability to support and help other LGBT people, no matter what problems we ourselves have, is a corner stone of OLGA's aim.

OLGA Befriending

National Research shows that LGBT people age single and alone, more so than hetereosexual people do. Isolation and depression can be eased by being part of a support network.

are all CRB checked.

If you would like a regular phone call, or email to ease your isolation, let us know - by phone/text or email.

OLGA Volunteers

OLGA, being a voluntary organisation, run by a steering group made up of older LGBT volunteers, is truly user led. We are all inclusive, having younger members also.

OLGA membership for Individuals is FREE. For Organisations, it is just £10 a year. Members get a Newsletter 4 times a year – and Organisation members get a discount on the OLGA equality and diversity training.

We have members all over the Country, not just in the Scarborough Area. Members have a right to Vote at the AGM and can be befriended, either by phone or email.

Prostate Cancer UK



Back in September, Mary Birch from OLGA, attended, and spoke at a conference hosted by Prostate Cancer

UK exploring the needs of gay and bisexual men diagnosed with prostate cancer. One of the issues raised there was a lack of support groups.

Since then Sean Ralph, a Therapy Radiographer in a cancer centre in the north west, has been in touch with OLGA. Sean has been working in partnership with Prostate Cancer UK and the Lesbian and Gay Foundation to set up a

prostate cancer support group for gay and bisexual men, which will be the first of its kind in the UK.

Remember social care providers (care homes, nursing homes) still say 'we don't have any of them here'.

Some pleasing news recently is that Stonewall are working with the Care Quality Commission to improve advice for health and social care providers for LGBT people. OLGA, however, is concerned that Stonewall traditionally does not deal with Trans issues. Trans people, like anyone will be heterosexual, lesbian, bisexual, gay. How the health and social care sector provides for their gender identity is essential.

Care Quality Commission inspectors will ask health and social care providers "what systems have you got in place to cater for the needs of gay and trans people?"

OTHER NEWS Uganda deports British theatre producer

A British theatre producer who angered Ugandan authorities by staging a play about

homosexuality has been deported back to the UK, leaving behind his partner and two children.David Cecil's deportation came as a shock to his family and legal team, who had been hoping to appeal against proceedings to expel him from Uganda, where

homosexuality is illegal. Cecil was charged last year after putting on The River and the Mountain, a play that explored the difficulties of being homosexual in Uganda, but the charges were dropped due to a lack of evidence. He was rearrested last week.

A transsexual deputy speaker could open people's eyes in Poland

Anna Grodzka has been nominated by her party to be deputy speaker, but opposition from politicians reflect wider prejudices.

The Polish MP Anna Grodzka could make history today by becoming the highest-ranking transsexual politician in the world. Grodzka, elected an MP in 2011 on the platform of the liberal Palikot's Movement, has been nominated by her party to become the deputy speaker of

Poland's lower house parliament. A parliamentary majority will now be needed to approve her candidacy. But the idea that man a who underwent a sex-change operation could become one of Poland's top officials has sparked controversy.

Gay marriage: some legal inequalities still remain

Gay couples will not be able to divorce on grounds of non-consummation or adultery with someone of the same gender.

The aim of the marriage (samegender couples) bill is to ensure that all couples enjoy equal marriage rights. Some elements of legal asymmetry remain, however, under the legislation. Those who draft the parliamentary bills have been unable to define what constitutes consummation of a same-gender union. Consequently there is no provision for divorce on the grounds of non-consummation of a gay marriage.

That problem also means that same-gender couples who wish to divorce will not be able to cite adultery with someone of the same gender – the civil servants similarly struggled to

find a definition of adultery between two men or two women. Adultery will, nonetheless, be a permitted grounds for divorce if it follows sexual intercourse between one of the couple and someone of the opposite gender. That, at least, is consistent with existing marriage laws: if a man decides he is gay and leaves his wife for a man, she can divorce him for unreasonable behaviour but not adultery, which is defined as sexual intercourse.

The need for older LGBT people to have their sexuality and gender identity to be received in a positive way, instead of being abused and discriminated against, is a matter of Human Rights.

Our family, which may consist of gay and trans friends, means that we want the rights to a family life, and recognition of our family in the same way as anyone else.

Abuse of lgbt people in health and social care venues must be tackled – more about the Human Rights Ambassador training in the next issue.
